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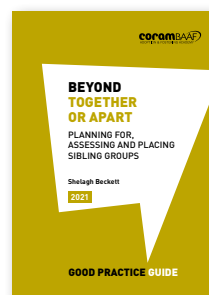
Complying with the GDPR and DPA 2018

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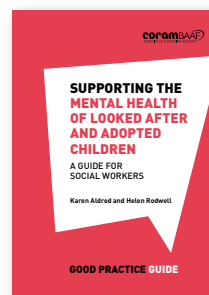

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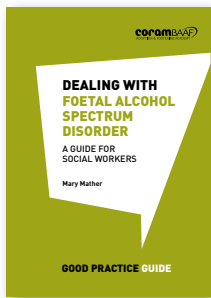
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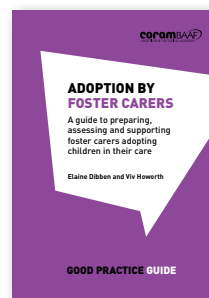
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Dealing with Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder

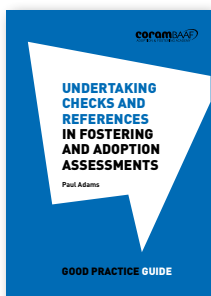
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Adoption by foster carers

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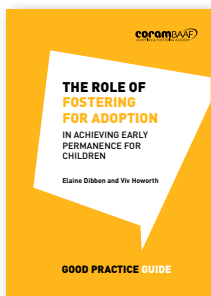
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Group work with adopted children and young people

Considers the practicalities of setting up a group, how best to structure the group and its activities, how to deal with any difficulties, and how to sustain a group long term. Case examples are provided from a range of local authority and VAA groups which are undertaking a variety of important work. Provides guidance on the practicalities of setting up a group, as well as imaginative ideas on widening the scope of existing groups.

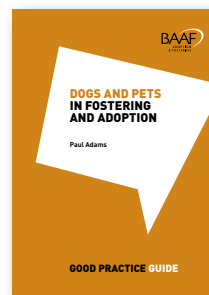
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The role of Fostering for Adoption

Focuses on identifying and sharing a range of practice developed by local authorities and VAAs around England and Wales. Taking a practical approach, it explores: the legislative framework and development of FfA; the children being placed; best practice in care planning and placement by FfA; recruitment, preparation, assessment and approval of FfA carers; managing the initial fostering placement; progressing the adoption match; and post-match considerations and adoption support.

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Dogs and pets in fostering and adoption

Provides a wealth of information and advice including: the relevance of breed; dogs and the law; the pros and cons of dog ownership; undertaking a dog assessment; ensuring that children and animals can live safely together; and key points to consider in matching, introductions and throughout placement.

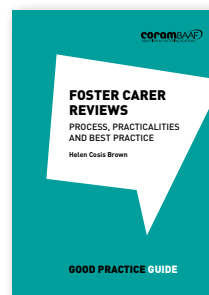
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Access to information for adult care leavers

It includes: an overview of the legislative framework; guidance on providing the best possible service; issues and dilemmas related to sharing information; and tracing and intermediary services.

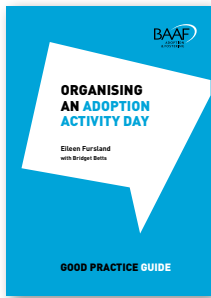
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Foster carer reviews

Sets out the process and practicalities of reviewing foster carers. It covers: the legal mandate; learning from inquiry reports and serious case reviews; social work knowledge underpinning the assessment and review processes; setting up reviews and organising their administration; information gathering; the review meeting; and the relationship of foster carers' reviews to fostering panels.

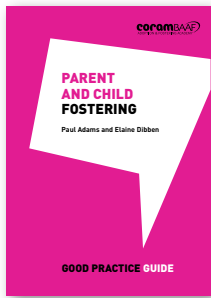
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Organising an Adoption Activity Day

Outlines how to set up and run an Adoption Activity Day. It includes practical guidance on: the principles and values that underpin Adoption Activity Days; a brief history of how they came about and their place in family finding today; planning and managing the day; preparing all the participants for the day; and managing the risks and addressing common concerns.

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Parent and child fostering

Addresses the challenge of providing placements for adults with their children, usually in the context of care proceedings. It includes information on: the legal context of parent and child arrangements; messages from research and serious case reviews; types of parent and child fostering; assessment and approval; training and supporting foster carers; care and placement planning; assessing parents; and good enough parenting.

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Recruiting, assessing and supporting lesbian and gay adopters

Reviews the legislation on lesbian and gay adoption, presents research findings about the outcomes for children placed with lesbian and gay adopters and explores policy and practice issues. It also discusses key concerns, including: how can social workers reassure applicants that they will be treated fairly?; and how can workers undertake an assessment without prejudice, whilst still being robust and covering all relevant areas?

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Writing a later life letter

Focuses on the practicalities of writing a later life letter and includes information on: what should and should not be included; how to explain difficult issues; the importance of tone and language; the place of the letter within life story work; and involving the adopters in writing the letter and explaining how best to share it with their child.

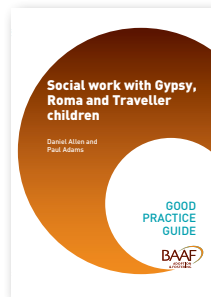
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Placing large sibling groups for adoption

Examines how adoption agency staff and children's social workers handle the adoption process for large sibling groups, with an emphasis on practices and policies which may help or hinder prospective adopters and the children they wish to adopt. Issues covered include: the recruitment, assessment and preparation of sibling group adopters; linking and matching; introductions and placement; supporting sibling group adopters; and the challenges and rewards of adopting a sibling group.

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Social work with Gypsy, Roma and Traveller children

Aims to help practitioners to work effectively with Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities, improve the outcomes for looked after children from these families, and help foster carers and adopters to provide the best placements for them. It explores: the legal and social policy context; culturally competent and anti-discriminatory casework; experiences of the care system; and placement issues.

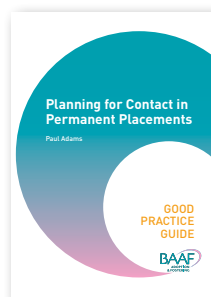
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Dealing with disruption

Focuses on what happens when children who move into permanent adoption or fostering placements have to move again contrary to expectations. It examines: the factors leading to disruption; managing and chairing disruption meetings; the impact of disruption on all concerned; and moving on from disruption.

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Planning for contact in permanent placements

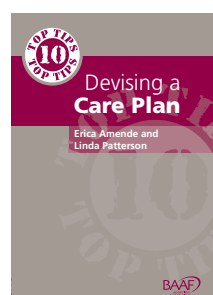
Aims to help practitioners to: formulate well thought out contact plans; make informed decisions resulting in improved outcomes for children; present well-argued and reasoned justifications for the contact plans set out in written reports; and feel more confident in recommending particular contact plans and defending them when necessary.

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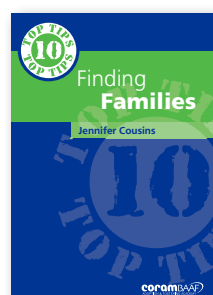

Devising a care plan

Considers some fundamental steps involved in devising a care plan. It explores the importance of tailoring the plan closely to the child; including their wishes and feelings; involving other adults; knowing when it's safe for the child to go home; and considering options such as care by relatives, fostering, adoption and residential care.

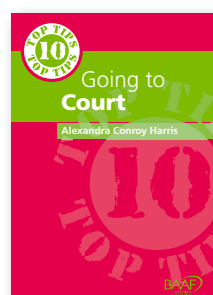
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Finding families

Explores the important issue of recruiting new carers and welcoming a wide range of permanent families. It addresses themes such as recruiting widely; preparing and assessing applicants; producing high quality material about children; and featuring them in a variety of ways. It also looks at methods of family finding, including exchange days and DVD/video profiling events.

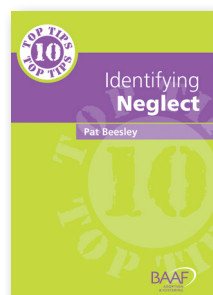
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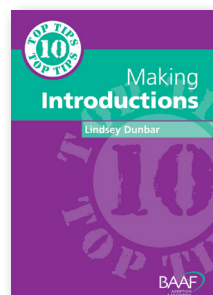
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Identifying neglect

Helps workers to consider their role in identifying and responding to child neglect. It explores: understanding why parents neglect their children; the lessons to be learned from serious case reviews; and how best to intervene to improve children's lives.

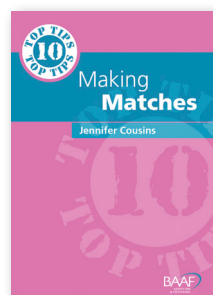
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Making introductions

Examines the purpose of introductions and how solid foundations can be laid for children to become fully integrated members of new families. It looks at: tailoring plans to the child's needs and ensuring he or she is properly prepared; ensuring the family is prepared for this particular child; planning introductions well whilst remaining flexible; and making introductions at the child's pace.

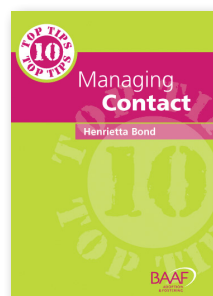
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Making matches

Considers the needs of children and adults and explores how a balance in meeting both can be maintained. Subjects covered include: assessing children thoroughly; understanding the proposed family and their needs; being sensitive to the complexities of ethnic matching; learning lessons from disruption; and providing support right from the start.

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Managing contact

Looks at the positive steps that can be taken to ensure that contact between separated children and their birth relatives is a beneficial experience. Subjects covered include: the purpose of contact; how to keep memories alive; how to prepare children for contact; and how to prepare and support adopters, foster carers and birth families.

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Placing children

Explores child placements, with an emphasis on evidence from practice and experience. It provides clear and concise accounts of what works and what does not, and includes the views of children and families. Checklists provide guidance on issues to be considered as well as suggestions of actions to be taken.

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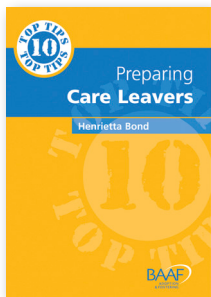
Placing disabled children
Addresses a range of key challenges, including: why and when do disabled children require permanent foster care or should they/could they be adopted?; how can suitable families be recruited and supported?; is it possible to work directly with all children, however seriously impaired?; and should a disabled child be separated from a sibling group? It provides an essential checklist for anyone seeking the right new family for a disabled child.

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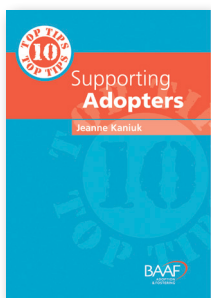
Placing siblings
Explores the different principles involved in placing looked after brothers and sisters. Issues covered include: keeping siblings together or helping them to part; listening to each child and getting to know the sibling group; using kinship care; recruiting and preparing families for specific sibling groups; and supporting siblings and families after placement.

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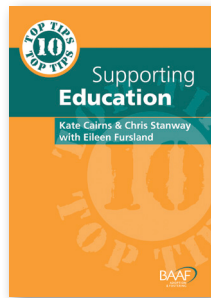
Preparing care leavers
Offers child-centred advice on: setting out to be a great corporate parent; having high aspirations for young people; helping care leavers achieve practical and budgeting skills for adult life; accessing housing and benefits; and supporting young people to live by themselves.

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Supporting adopters
Describes the legal framework within which adoption support services are offered and indicates some of the principles on which a successful support service depends. Includes chapters on financial support for adoptive families, supporting members of the adoptive parents' wider family, contact, managing children's difficult behaviour and identifying resources.

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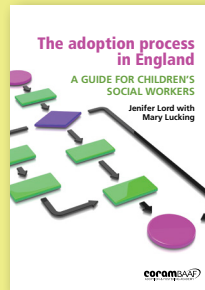
Supporting education
Explores the ways in which looked after children can be best supported to enable them to thrive and achieve their potential at school and beyond. Subjects covered include: assessing the impact of personal and family history on a child's education; getting to know and work with the carers; finding out about the school; forming relationships with key school staff members; facilitating links between carers and the school; and supporting the child through transitions.

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Supporting kinship placements

It looks at some of the fundamental steps that can be taken to ensure that kinship care is as successful as possible for everyone involved. Issues covered include: working with the whole kinship network; recognising the challenges of contact in kinship care; and being aware of diversity and conflicts in the family.
